Madrid will host the 1st AIBR International Conference of Anthropology

The conference will receive 900 delegates from more than 30 countries.

The Network of Iberoamerican Anthropologists (AIBR) organizes the 1st AIBR International Conference of Anthropology with the theme *The Human Being, Cultures, Origins and Destiny*, which will take place in the School of Psychology of the Autonomous University of Madrid (Spain) between the 7th and 10th of July 2015.

The conference will be a meeting point for over 900 participants: researchers, scholars, and students that work in Sociocultural Anthropology, Linguistic anthropology, and archaeology.

Representatives from more than 30 countries will make plenary sessions, panels, book presentations, round tables and film events. The official languages of the conference are Spanish, English, and Portuguese.

The conference will be inaugurated by **Dr. Paulo Speller**, General Secretary of the Organization of Iberoamerican States for Education, Sciences, and Culture (OEI).

This event intents to further increase the knowledge accumulated after years of investigation in the realm of Anthropology, while exploring the fascinating variety of interests that deal with anthropological studies at the beginning of the third millennium.

The organizing committee invites to the conference all the people that share an interest on the Anthropological discipline. This will be a great opportunity to explore the topics that have been inexorably repeated within every culture on the planet: what are we and what is our ultimate destiny?
